

Win First Aid Prize

OTTAWA, Ont., Dec. 13.—The all-lines championship in the Canadian Pacific Railway first-aid competition was won here Thursday by the Windsor station police team.

The competition took place at Albion hall and was conducted by Col. G. A. Hodgetts, director general of the St. John Ambulance Association. The winning team got 315.5 points out of a possible 425. The score of the Nelson shops' team, which was the runner-up, was 268.5. The Windsor station police team was composed of Owen Tomlinson, William Peterson, Ernest G. Sykes, William H. Allison (captain), and Andrew H. Stott.

The members of the Nelson team were, Walter Crowther, Joseph Fairburn, William Woods, Frederick Blakeman (captain), and John Shardelow.

The Montreal team came second this year for the eastern Shaughnessey shield, which is the badge of success in the police competition. This team also won the Shaughnessey shield last year. The Nelson team holds the western lines' shield in the railway first-aid competition for the present year.
