**ST. OLAVE'S GRAMMAR SCHOOL.**—Yesterday's annual speeches in this school, which was established in the reign of Queen Elizabeth, took place at the School in Bermondsey, and prizes were delivered to such students as had distinguished themselves during the year. The governors, of whom there was a large number, attended public service at St. Olave's church, where a sermon was preached by the Rev. Charles Browne, D.D., Rector of Lambeth. They then proceeded to the school, and the chair having been taken by John Ledger, Esq., warden, the following speeches were delivered:—the opening of St. Augustine's Missionary College, London, June 29, 1848, part 1, by Mr. Alfred W.
